



DENISE SCOTT

COMEDIAN, BROADCASTER, WRITER, ACTOR & PRESENTER

Denise Scott has been treading the boards for longer than she cares to remember, but it is this wealth of experience that makes her one of the country's strongest live comic performers. Since her start in the biz in the early 1980's, Scotty has been making people laugh with her blend of personal stories and topical observations.

In 2004 Scotty received a Barry Award nomination (for Best Show) at the Melbourne Comedy Festival for her sold out festival hit, Scotty and Son, which featured her nineteen year-old son. She repeated the feat with her 2005 Festival show Denise Scott Gives Good Council. Scotty has always been one of the most highly regarded comedians in the country, but now in her fifties with a couple of teenage kids she is experiencing a resurgence in popularity. So much so that she has landed arguably the most hotly contested post going in Melbourne in 2005. Melbourne's newest radio station Vega 91.5 broadcast its first breakfast show on Monday 5 September with Denise, Shaun Micallef & Beverley O'Connor creating a new page not only in Scotty's brilliant career, but a chapter in radio history as well.
